#### 34.9 Popinjay Archery

The rules for Popinjay described below are for the Horizontal version of Popinjay originating in Belgium and shot in Southern Ontario.

- 34.9.1 Set-up for Popinjay
  - 34.9.1.1 The full complement of a Popinjay racks (perches) shall consist of:
    - (i) One (1) High Bird
    - (ii) Two (2) Side Birds
    - (iii) Two (2) Kales
    - (iii) Thirty-three (33) Small Birds



Typical Popinjay 'roost' showing minimum complement.

34.9.1.2 These birds shall project 3/8" (10mm) above the pins and cannot be any larger than 5/8" in diameter. **34.9.2 Archers Equipment** 

- 34.9.2.1 No team shooters are allowed to use sights of any sort. This includes any type of mechanical devices. No marks on the face or the belly of the bow, the string or the arrow.
- 34.9.2.2 The uses of any automatic releases are also restricted.
- 34.9.2.3 Arrows The pile (blunt) shall not exceed 1 1/8" (29 mm) in diameter.

#### 34.9.3 Shooting

34.9.3.1 All International shooting competitions shall be set from a distance of 65 feet (19.81 meters) from the shooting line to the high bird.

34.9.3.2 **Only one shooter** allowed in marked area when shooting.

#### 34.9.4 Range Captain

34.9.4.1 It shall be the duty of the range captain to rule on the safety of all equipment used by the archers.

34.9.4.2 Failure to comply with his recommendations of corrective measures is cause for disqualification.
